

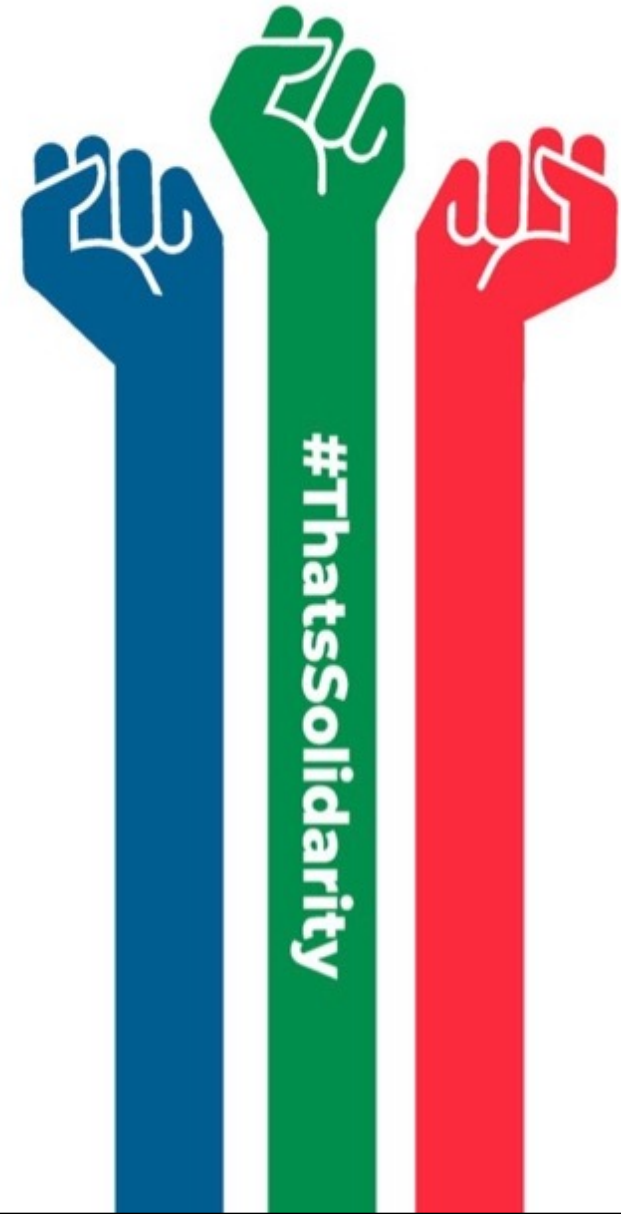

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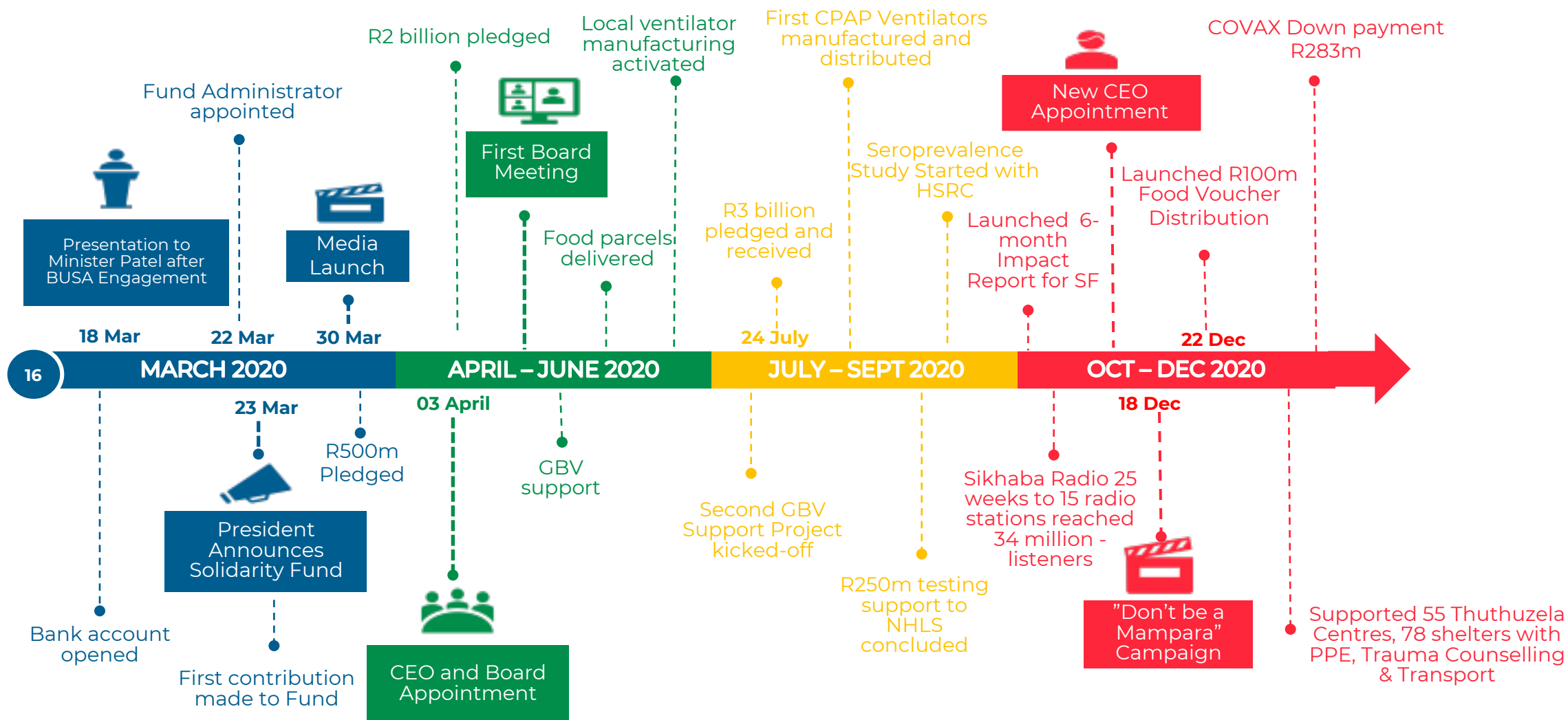

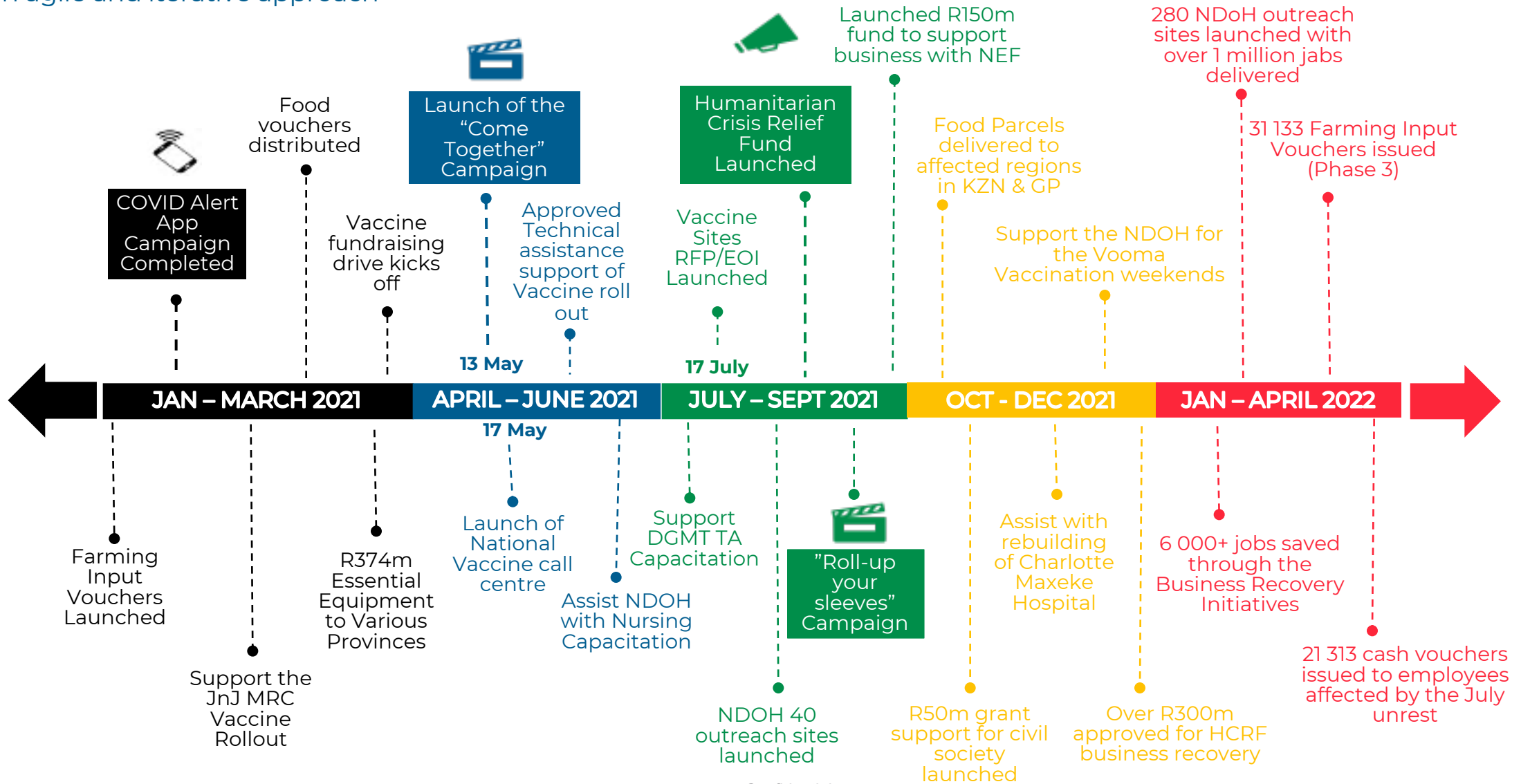

# Principles of Solidarity



## Strong, Independent Board of Directors

Governed by an independent board of directors led by Ms. Gloria Serobe, and includes independent and experienced board members from business, government and civil society that guide and oversee the Fund.



## Empowered and Accountable Leadership

The leadership team operates in an agile manner, aligned with the rapid response focus of the Fund, but always subject to the governance required to ensure that all contributions to the Fund are recognized, accounted for and effectively managed, and to ensure that all disbursements are aligned with the Fund's mandate.



## Alignment with National Strategy

Works closely with Government and Business for South Africa but is entirely independent. Committed to aligning with the National Health Strategy in order to deliver the greatest possible impact. The Fund is focused on initiatives that are inclusive across the country where there is great need.



## Transparency

Committed to transparency in all the Fund's work, from fundraising to disbursements. The Fund holds itself accountable to all South Africans.



## Speed and Scale

The Fund is a rapid response vehicle - it moves at speed and focusses on scale in order to be catalytic, to fill gaps, and to deliver impact quickly across the nation at this time of crisis.

# Allocation of Funds

A significant proportion of the disbursement value is directed toward supporting the Health Response. The Humanitarian Effort to support the most vulnerable households and communities, also receives significant funding, these interventions are complemented by other interventions from Business, Civil Society and Government given the size and nature of the needs. The Solidarity Behaviour Change Campaign also requires significant resources, whilst also leveraging in-kind and value added contributions.

# Allocation of Funds for Humanitarian Crisis Relief



- Small businesses are the lifeblood of our communities and economy, providing employment and access to goods and supporting suppliers. SMME's account for 89% of the businesses impacted by the civil unrest. Small businesses provide more than 70% of the jobs in South Africa, and these businesses stand to lose R3.4 billion a month in revenue to resume operations. This while they need more than R16 billion in operational funding to recover.
- This is why, together with The National Empowerment Fund (NEF), the Humanitarian Crisis Relief Fund has established a R450m Unrest Relief Fund targeting small, medium and micro enterprises (SMMEs) that are able to demonstrate that they were negatively impacted by the unrest in both provinces.

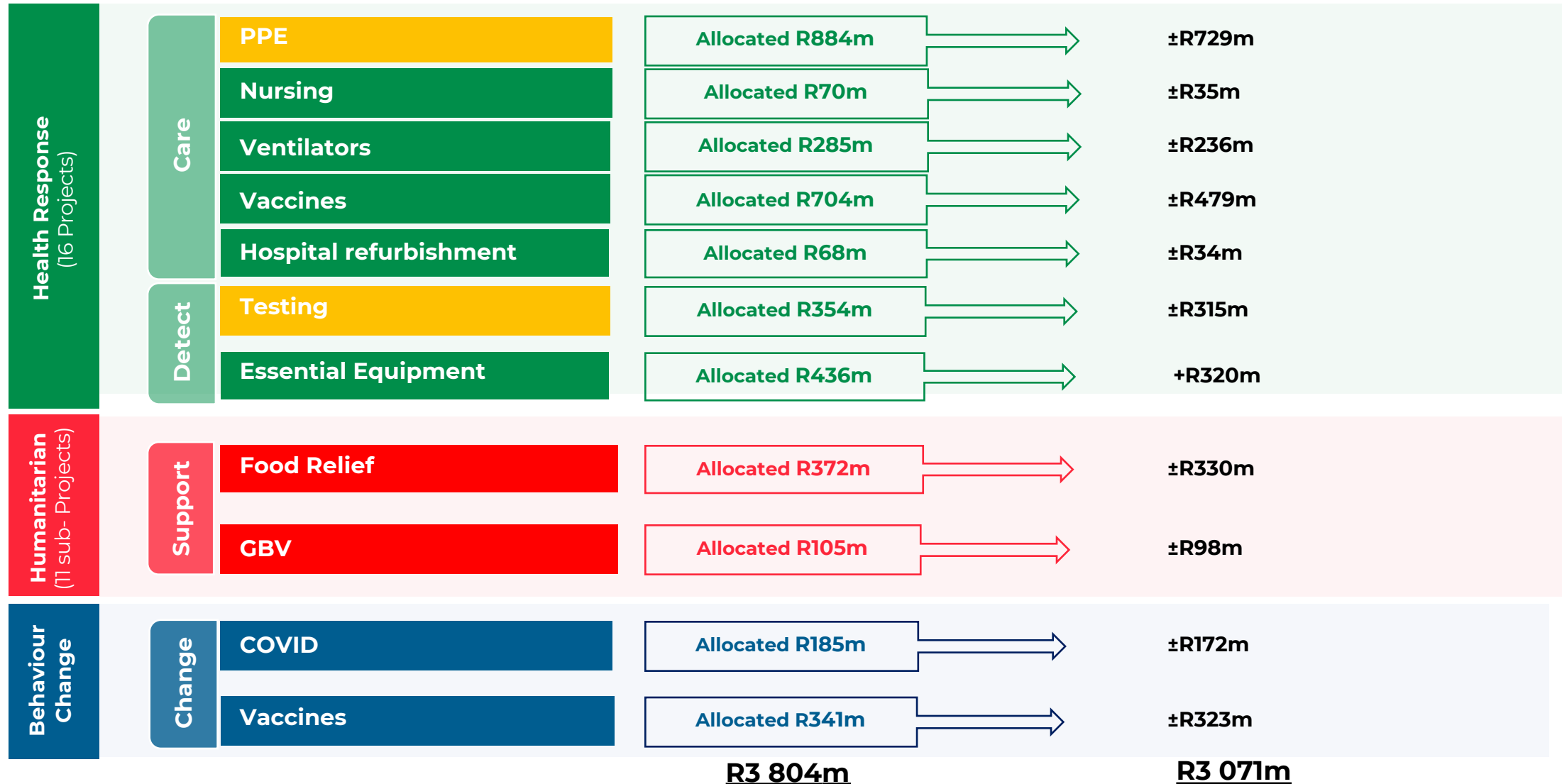

## Vaccines



### Sisonke

- The fund contributed **R50m** to support the JnJ MRC Sisonke Implementation Study to vaccinate 500 000 HCWs.
- **496 424** HCWs vaccinated through the study.

### Covax down-payment

- R283.3m down payment in January 2021
- **2 574 000** doses received
- **5,6m** doses were donated by the US Government in July/Aug 2021

### Transportation of 23G needles

- **R1.18m** was utilized to import **6m** 23G needles by air freight from China to SA

### Transportation of donated US Pfizer doses through Covax

- **R8.5m** paid to COVAX for transportation of **5,6m donated Pfizer doses**

### Surge/Outreach sites

- **280 sites** operating in all **9 provinces**.
- **1 070 806** vaccinations administered between Aug 2021 – 26 April 2022 by **17** clinical operators

### DOH TA Capacitation

- **R69m** disbursed for technical assistance to the NDoH by DGMT (50% of a co-funded project)
- **198 out of 243** national, provincial and district candidates appointed.
- Project closing. Most TA capacitation contracts ended 31 March, except for 72 roles extended to 30 June at NDoH request

## Impact & Reach

J&J Sisonke managed to vaccinate **496 424** HCWs.

Surge/Outreach Sites have administered **over 1 million** vaccinations between Aug and April.

**198 out of 243 (81%)** national, provincial and district candidates appointed to provide TA to NDoH and Provinces

## Healthcare Capacitation



### Nursing Capacitation (GP)

- A total of **R23.4m** approved for GP Nurses Project to assist with Covid-19 3rd and 4th wave surges.
- **8 150** nurse shifts made available
- Project ended 31 March 2022. Final recon and reporting under way.

### Nursing Capacitation (EC)

- **R46.8m** allocated to fund nurses, district outreach teams, and costs for setting up outreach sites across **4 EC districts** - Alfred Nzo, Amathole, Joe Gqabi and OR Tambo
- **77% (311 out of 405)** of HR resources placed to assist with the 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> waves

### Charlotte Maxeke Hospital

- **R78m** approved for the refurbishment of Block 1 as part of the CMJH Phase 1 reopening
- Level 6, Block One (**phase 1**) **not yet opened**, awaiting COJ for certificate of occupation (inspection done 30 March).
- Phase 2 SOW and Bill of Quantities is under review. Contracted independent QS Godfrey Place to manage phase 2 which will be completed in March 2023.

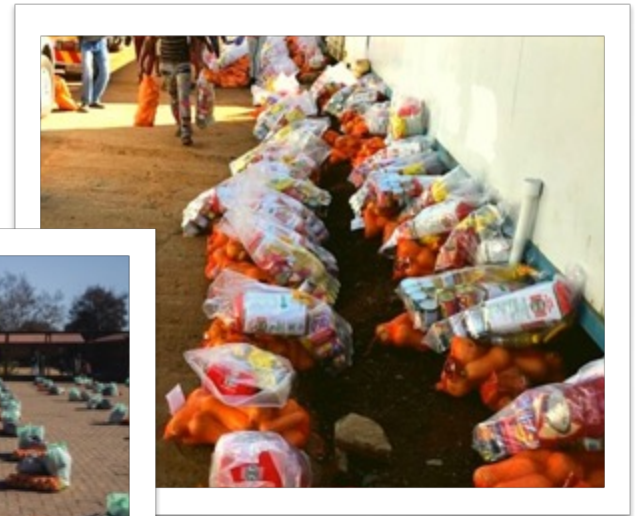

# Behaviour change efforts – National COVID call centre



AS AT 30 APRIL 2022



- The Centre continues to operate with significant capacity and all RSPs have maintained headcount
- 30 124 calls handled in the week 18-26 April 2022
- National Healthcare Workers Helpline integration implementation started – went live on 1 April
- Hardware being installed to identify caller numbers for abandoned calls, to start call backs
- Escalations mainly related to EVDS issues, with majority tickets escalated to EVDS Helpdesk
- Ongoing optimization of the quality assurance, escalations and scripts processes

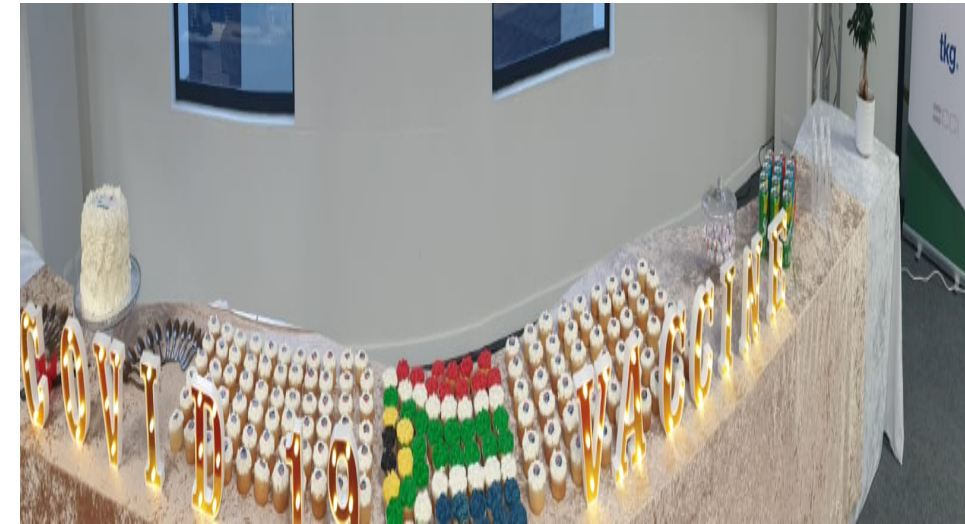

# Behaviour change efforts – NCP



AS AT 30 APRIL 2022



- Content distribution focused on holiday-based messaging in the lead up to and over the Easter weekend.
- Developing an animation clarifying the impact of COVID-19 on male sexual reproduction, specifically to address concerns regarding impotency and the vaccine.
- Developing content in advance of the expected next COVID wave.
- Workshops in parts of KZN have been delayed due to ongoing flooding. The impact on the programmes in the province are being assessed.

## CCF

- Held mobilization and activation events in Gauteng, North-West, KwaZulu-Natal, Mpumalanga, Limpopo

## COVID Comms

- Hosted a national workshop to review the impact of COVID communications over the last two years.
- Social media content addressing myths was developed and translated and workshops continued.

## SACC

- SACC #Vaxmzansi campaign recorded video of faith leaders ahead of Easter weekend encouraging vaccinations and non-pharmaceutical interventions.

## Impact & Reach

**7 100** branded #VaxuMzansi masks distributed nationally

**40** posters provided to **20** catholic churches

**213** individuals vaccinated through SACC engagement

**187** faith leaders and youth trained through SACC's "Train the Trainer" workshops

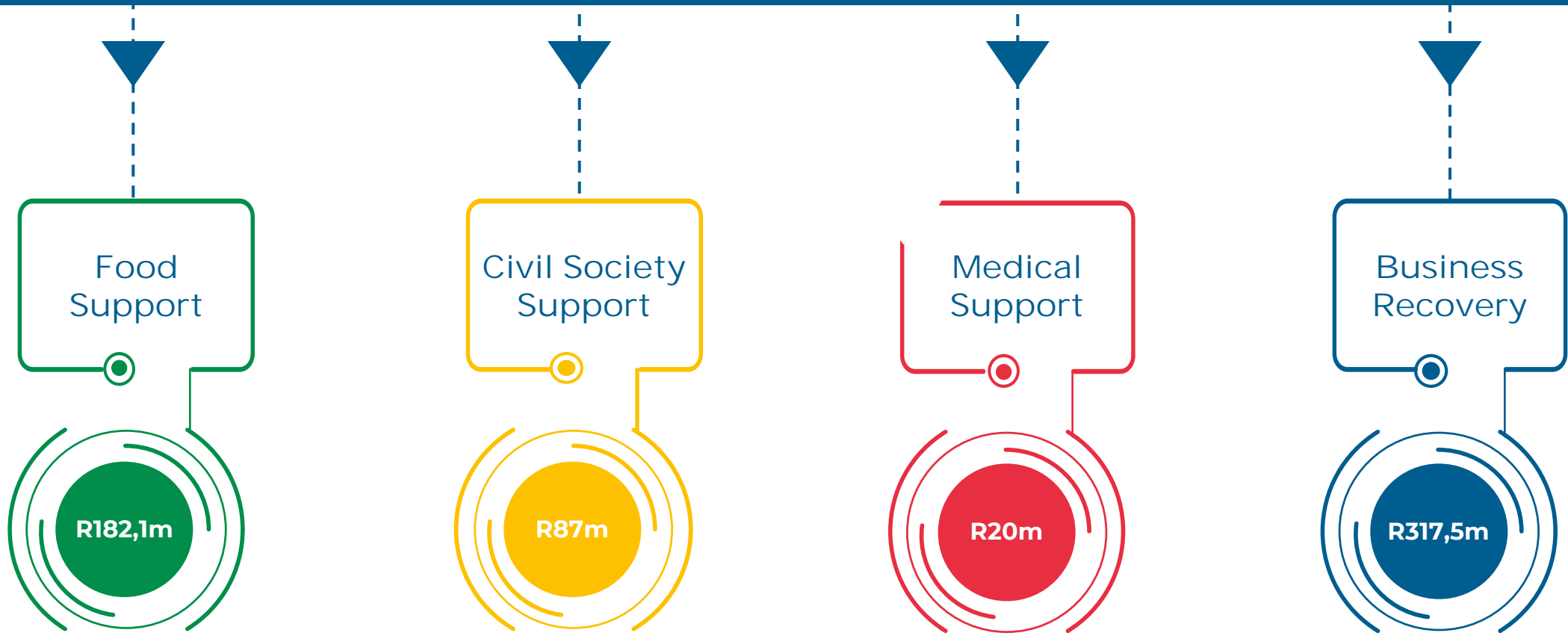

# HCRF – Food relief response



AS AT 30 APRIL 2022



- Two food relief projects have been completed by the HCRF.
  - Food parcels through the DSD in KZN and GP (HCRF001)
  - Food parcels through the PHTL in KZN (HCRF002)
- Register recon for the PHTL envelope is ongoing. A total of **18 285** (out of 21 000) registers from **178** (out of 196) traditional councils received.
- A consolidated impact report is in drafting for publication on the website

## Impact & Reach

### DSD

A total of **135 662** parcels (KZN-81 376; GP-54 286) were delivered.

This represents **99%** of the original target.

It is estimated that approximately **678 310** individuals benefitted from these food parcels.

### PHTL

A total of **21 450** parcels were delivered across **196** traditional councils

# HCRF – Civil society grant and cash voucher program

## Civil Society Grants

- **R86 950 205** disbursed.
- All grantees have been loaded onto Tshikululu’s system
- **39** applications approved; **24** grants paid, 9 grant signed and ready for payment

## Cash Voucher Program

- **21 313** beneficiaries issued cash vouchers to a value of R63,9m (**99%** of issuing target).
- **18 600** vouchers redeemed at a total value of R55.8m (**93%** redemption rate of issued).
- The next payment call for 799 vouchers went out on 26 April

## Impact & Reach

### Cash Voucher Program

**21 313** individuals have received their R3000 cash voucher

**93%** of vouchers redeemed to date
