





# **VACCINATION PROGRAMMES**

#### Sisonke

- The fund contributed **R50m** to support the JnJ MRC Sisonke Implementation Study to vaccinate 500 000 HCWs.
- 496 424 HCWs vaccinated through the study.

## **Covax down-payment**

- R283.3m down payment in January 2021 with 2 574 000 doses received
- **5,6m** doses were donated by the US Government in July/Aug 2021

 R1.18m was utilized to import 6m 23G needles by air freight from China to SA

# VACCINATION PROGRAMMES CONTINUED



## Surge/Outreach sites

- 320 sites opened in all 9 provinces.
- 1 392 051 vaccinations administered between Aug 2021 30 June 2022 by 20 clinical operators

## **DOH TA Capacitation**

- R69m disbursed for technical assistance to the NDoH by DGMT (50% of a co-funded project)
- 198 out of 243 national, provincial and district candidates appointed. Project closing, with final reporting expected end July.

# **Nursing Capacitation (EC)**

- R46.8m allocated to fund nurses, district outreach teams, and costs for setting up outreach sites across 4 EC districts - Alfred Nzo, Amathole, Joe Gqabi and OR Tambo
- 311 medical HR resources placed to assist with the 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> waves
- Project closed 31 May and project close out reconciliations and reporting is in process

- A total of **R23.4m** approved for GP Nurses Project to assist with Covid-19 3rd and 4th wave surges. Project ended 31 March 2022. Final recon and reporting under way.
- 8 000+ nurse shifts made available

# **Charlotte Maxeke Hospital**

- R78m approved for the refurbishment of Block 1 as part of the CMJH Phase 1 reopening
- Phase 1 Level 6, Block One A&E unit opened 9 May by MoH
- Phase 2 grant and donations agreements completed. Contracting is currently taking place. SPIRE will manage phase 2 which will be completed by March 2023.

# Modular Hospital to ECDoH for Cecilia Makiwane

Hospital opened and was admitting COVID patients since September 2021. In Feb 2022, contract extended to 30 June 2022 to procure fire safety equipment.
Equipment has been procured and delivered with Siemens managing installation. To date the sprinkler installation is complete and pressure tested, and ceilings and associated services re-installed.












Three areas of focus identified - food, shelter (incl. water and sanitation), and trauma/grief counselling

#### **Food Forward SA**

- Provided 167 328 warm cooked meals to date to 4 833 displaced people in 30 community halls.
- Spent ~R 1,3m of the total grant of R5m towards the flood response.

#### WeFeedSA

- Completed assessments on boreholes, schools and homes. Still negotiating prices for boreholes and obtaining quotes from various renovation contractors for schools and homes repairs.
- Spent ~ R20 000 in project costs relating to pre-execution activities and 1st borehole drilling to commence on 05/07
