- A total of **R23.4m** approved for GP Nurses Project to assist with Covid-19 3rd and 4th wave surges. Project ended 31 March 2022. Final recon and reporting under way.

Charlotte Maxeke Hospital

- **R78m** approved for the refurbishment of Block 1 as part of the CMJH Phase 1 reopening
- **Phase 1** - Level 6, Block One A&E unit **opened 9 May by MoH**
- Phase 2 grant and donations agreements completed. Contracting is currently taking place. SPIRE will manage phase 2 which will be completed by March 2023.
- Work has started on levels 8 and 9 of Block 1 South tower and is currently 12% complete in terms of the duration of the programme

Modular Hospital to ECDoH for Cecilia Makiwane

- Hospital opened and admitting COVID patients since September 2021. In Feb 2022, contract extended to procure fire safety equipment. Equipment has been procured and delivered with Siemens managing installation. To date the sprinkler installation is complete and pressure tested, and ceilings and associated services re-installed.

Food Forward SA (FFSA)

- Provided 234 900 warm cooked meals to date to 4 833 displaced people in 31 community halls.
- FFSA procures quality nutritious food and provides it to the respective Beneficiary Organisations (BOs) to prepare meals for each community hall.
- Third-party transporters deliver the prepared food and food preparers to each site to serve beneficiaries directly.

SA Harvest

- Will deliver food parcels, fresh produce, and e-pap to 4 764 displaced families in 12 KZN districts.
- To date 2 667 food parcels have been distributed in eThekweni and Richards Bay (56% of target).

Heal Our Land

- Distributed 36% of total hygiene packs to 3000 individuals in 65 KZN community halls to date.
- Will provide 2 000 households wash packs and blankets as beneficiaries migrate from halls back to their homes.

- Repairs to 17 of the 50 homes targeted for repair and restorative solutions are underway.

KZNCC

- Approximately 595 families to be provided with temporary shelter and access to tents, water, mattresses, and toilets, while they rebuild their homes
- To date, 250 tents, 580 mattresses, 123 water tanks, and 63 toilets have been procured. The first installation of 22 tents, water tanks, and toilets took place at Ntuzuma community hall.

Mezzanine Ware (MW) and Standard Bank (SBSA)

- 193 of the R30 000 building material vouchers issued to the value of R5 790 000 (64% of target).
