





IMPACT & REACH: Food and Essential Hygiene Products





Food Forward SA

- FFSA has concluded their meal distribution on the 16th of September 2022
- Approximately 526 599 meals were provided to beneficiaries living in ~31 KwaZulu-Natal community halls (126% of distribution target). *The final distribution figures are subject to SF reconciliation
- Project documentation has been shared with SF for reconciliation



SA Harvest

- SA Harvest concluded their contract on the 31st of August 2022
- SA Harvest has reached their distribution target. 4754 food parcels were handed over to beneficiaries in eThekwini and Richards Bay.

Heal Our Land

- Heal Our Land (HOL) concluded their project activities on the 16th of September 2022. They have distributed hygiene packs to 4120 flood victims in 60 KZN community halls.
- HOL distributed individual wash kits and blankets to 2027 flood victims (101% of target)







IMPACT & REACH: Integrated Shelter





weFeedSA

- weFeedSA concluded their contract with the Solidarity Fund on 20th of September 2022
- 30 boreholes are fully installed and handed over to beneficiaries.
- WeFeedSA has rebuilt and handed over their full target of 10 schools that were affected by floods. 50 home repairs have been completed reaching 100% of target and distributed appliances and furniture to 44 homes.



KZNCC

- The KZNCC and Solidarity Fund contract has come to an end on the 16th of September 2022
- KZNCC completed installation of **350** tents, **1334** mattresses and **177** toilets. **103** water tanks are fully installed at various KZN sites. Approximately 350 families have been provided with temporary shelter and have access to water, mattresses and toilets.
- The temporary shelters will be utilised for up to 7 months or until beneficiaries receive a permanent solution to the housing problem.
- Project documentation is being submitted and the Solidarity Fund is currently reconciling the information.



MezzanineWare

- The contract was concluded on the 20th of September 2022
- MezzanineWare has issued 300 building material vouchers valued at a total of R9 000 000 (100% of target).
- About 90.46% of the issued vouchers have been redeemed by beneficiaries amounting to ~R8 742 530

Standard Bank

- Standard Bank issued 300 Instant Money Vouchers valued at R10 000 each for the purposes of facilitating transportation of building materials and labour.
- The amount issued was R3 000 000 and thus far a total of R2 655 000 has been redeemed (88.5% voucher redemption rate).





IMPACT & REACH: Psychosocial Support





Heal Our Land

- Heal Our Land had targeted 1000 individuals for psychosocial support and 1202 flood victims were reached through group hearings. 433 individuals were counselling sessions.
- Heal Our Land has commenced with 2 support groups (40% of target) and planned to continue providing 3 more support groups which started in October 2022.



KZNCC

- KZNCC has provided 350 families with trauma counselling.
- 1159 individuals including children, between the ages of 4 14 years have been provided with trauma counselling.
- KZNCC has reached 116% of their targeted beneficiaries for grief and trauma counselling.
