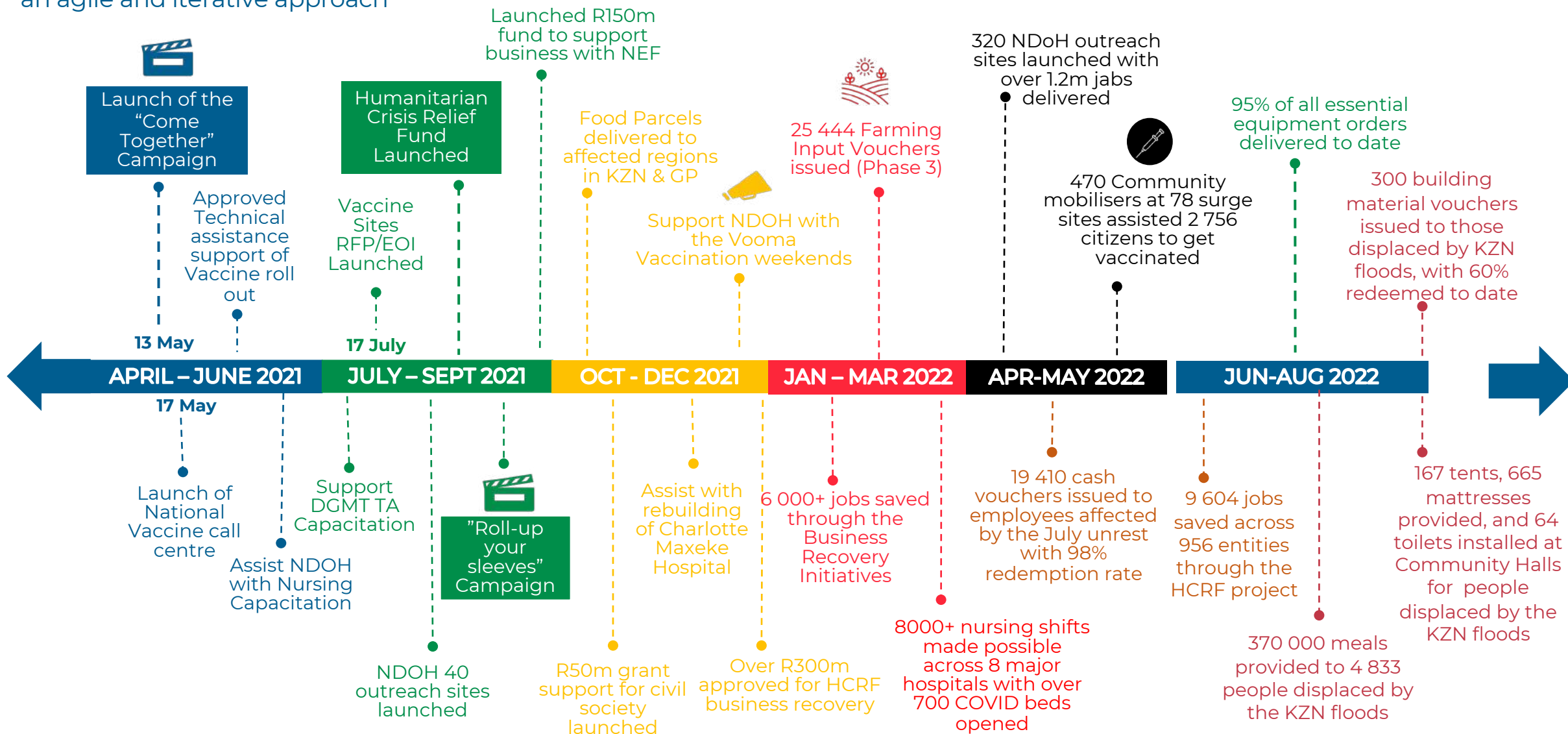

- **78% (R5.7m) of R7.3m** orders delivered to date. Delivery of beds (which have a long lead time) has commenced.

### Free State

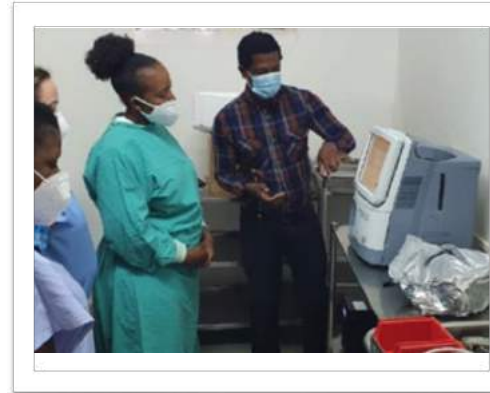

### Sisonke

- The fund contributed **R50m** to support the JnJ MRC Sisonke Implementation Study to vaccinate 500 000 HCWs.
- **496 424** HCWs vaccinated through the study.

### Covax down-payment

- R283.3m down payment in January 2021 with **2 574 000** doses received
- **5,6m** doses were donated by the US Government in July/Aug 2021

### Transportation of 23G needles

- **R1.18m** was utilized to import **6m** 23G needles by air freight from China to SA

### Transportation of donated US Pfizer doses through Covax

- **R8.5m** paid to COVAX for transportation of **5,6m donated Pfizer doses**

## Impact & Reach

J&J Sisonke managed to vaccinate **496 424** HCWs.

Surge/Outreach Sites have administered **over 1.2 million** vaccinations between Aug and April.

**198 out of 243 (81%)** national, provincial and district candidates appointed to provide TA to NDoH and Provinces

- **R69m** disbursed for technical assistance to the NDoH by DGMT (50% of a co-funded project)
- **201 of 243** national, provincial and district candidates appointed
- Project closing, with close-out reporting in progress

### Nursing Capacitation (EC)

- **R46.8m** allocated to fund nurses, district outreach teams, and costs for setting up outreach sites across **4 EC districts** - Alfred Nzo, Amathole, Joe Gqabi and OR Tambo
- **311** medical HR resources placed to assist with the 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> waves
- Project closed 31 May and project close out reconciliations and reporting is in process

- **8 000+** nurse shifts were made available through this project

### Charlotte Maxeke Hospital

- **R78m** approved for the refurbishment of Block 1 as part of the CMJH Phase 1 reopening
- **Phase 1** - Level 6, Block One A&E unit **opened 9 May by MoH**
- Phase 2 grant and donations agreements completed. All contractors have been appointed and work has started on levels 8 and 9 of Block 1 South tower.
- SPIRE will manage phase 2 which will be completed by March 2023.

### Modular Hospital to ECDoH for Cecilia Makiwane

- Hospital opened and admitting COVID patients since September 2021. In Feb 2022, contract extended to procure fire safety equipment. Equipment has been procured and delivered with Siemens managing installation. To date the sprinkler installation is complete and pressure tested, and ceilings and associated services re-installed.

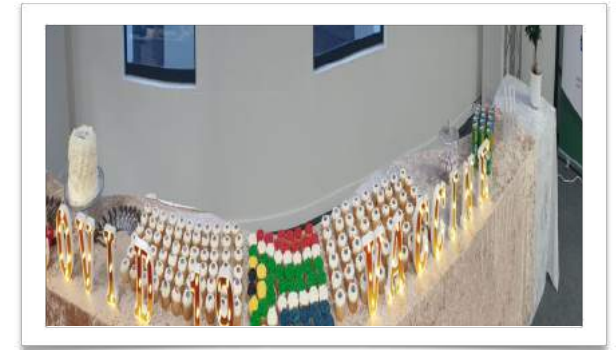

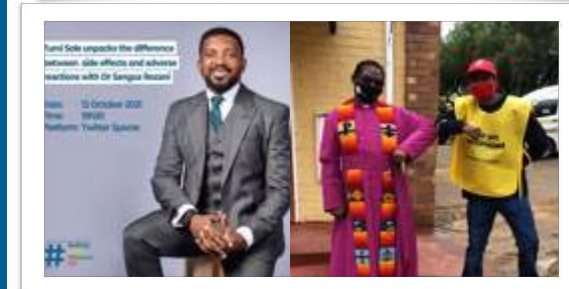

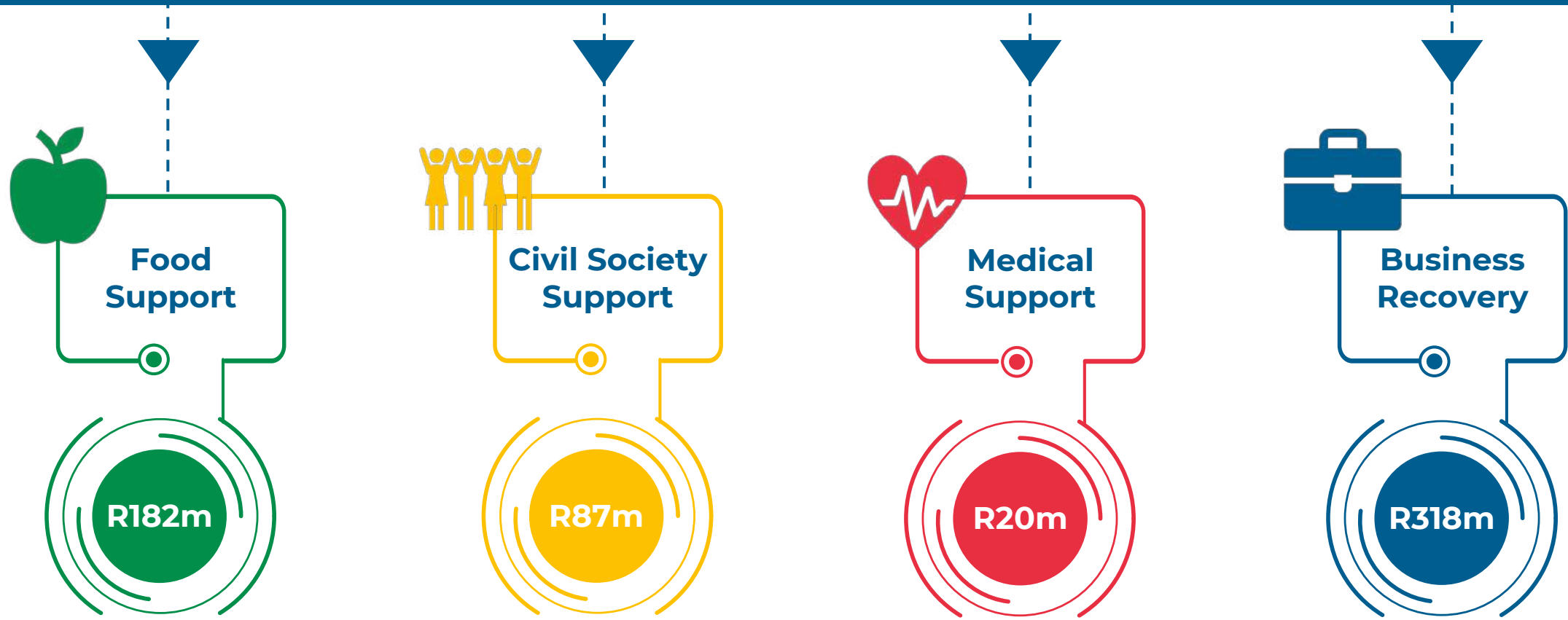

### **Food Forward SA (FFSA)**

- Provided 370 000 warm cooked meals to date to 4 833 displaced people in 31 community halls.
- FFSA procures quality nutritious food and provides it to the respective Beneficiary Organisations (BOs) to prepare meals for each community hall.
- Third-party transporters deliver the prepared food and food preparers to each site to serve beneficiaries directly.

### **SA Harvest**

- Will deliver food parcels, fresh produce, and e-pap to 4 764 displaced families in 12 KZN districts.
- All 4 764 food parcels have been distributed in eThekweni and Richards Bay (100% of target)

### **Heal Our Land**

- Distributed hygiene packs to 4 120 to flood victims in 60 KZN community halls
- Distribution of individual wash kits and blankets have reached 1 755 flood victims (87% of target)

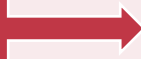

- Rebuilding of 9 of the 10 schools identified for rebuilding and repairs has been completed
- Repairs to 33 of the 50 homes targeted for repair and restorative solutions have been completed

### KZNCC

- Approximately 595 families to be provided with temporary shelter and access to tents, water, mattresses, and toilets, while they rebuild their homes
- To date, 167 (of 350) tents, 665 (of 1 400) mattresses, and 64 (of 350) toilets have been procured and installed
- 350 water tanks have been procured and in delivery

### Mezzanine Ware (MW) and Standard Bank (SBSA)

- 300 of the R30 000 building material vouchers issued to the value of R9m (100% of target). 60% have been redeemed to date.
- 300 of the R10 000 cash vouchers to facilitate rebuilding (labour and transport) have been issued, with 82% redeemed to date.
