



FOOD AND ESSENTIAL PRODUCTS



Disbursed ±R13.2m

Food Forward SA (FFSA)

- Provided 370 000 warm cooked meals to date to 4 833 displaced people in 31 community halls.
- FFSA procures quality nutritious food and provides it to the respective Beneficiary Organisations (BOs) to prepare meals for each community hall.
- Third-party transporters deliver the prepared food and food preparers to each site to serve beneficiaries directly.

SA Harvest

- Will deliver food parcels, fresh produce, and e-pap to 4 764 displaced families in 12 KZN districts.
- All 4 764 food parcels have been distributed in eThekwini and Richards Bay (100% of target)

Heal Our Land

- Distributed hygiene packs to 4 120 to flood victims in 60 KZN community halls
- Distribution of individual wash kits and blankets have reached 1755 flood victims (87% of target)

- Rebuilding of 9 of the 10 schools identified for rebuilding and repairs has been completed
- Repairs to 33 of the 50 homes targeted for repair and restorative solutions have been completed

KZNCC

- Approximately 595 families to be provided with temporary shelter and access to tents, water, mattresses, and toilets, while they rebuild their homes
- To date, 167 (of 350) tents, 665 (of 1 400) mattresses, and 64 (of 350) toilets have been procured and installed
- 350 water tanks have been procured and in delivery

Mezzanine Ware (MW) and Standard Bank (SBSA)

- 300 of the R30 000 building material vouchers issued to the value of R9m (100% of target).
 60% have been redeemed to date.
- 300 of the R10 000 cash vouchers to facilitate rebuilding (labour and transport) have been issued, with 82% redeemed to date.
